Leaving a legacy:

Looking out for future generations

We are protecting and managing the environment for current and future generations. Community urged to report feral deer sightings; Rehabilitation of creek and river banks damaged by unprecedented flows in the February flood; Work began to draft the Tweed Conservation Strategy.

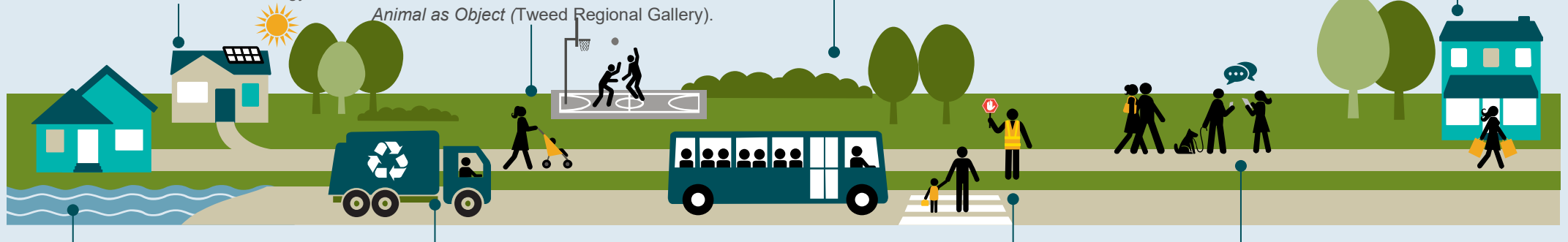
We are creating a better place to live, work, visit, play and enjoy Anzac Day services held across Shire, Held Live and Local Tweed micro festival and online workshops; Sought Expressions of Interest for markets at Jack Evans Boat Harbour; Launched new Museum Ambassador Program; Exhibitions: *Pattern and Print: Easton Pearson Archive* and *Animal as Object* (Tweed Regional Gallery).

We are building and maintaining an integrated, connected and accessible transport network. Contract awarded to repair Scenic Drive; 10 scheduled road projects completed and 131 underway.

Making decisions with you:

We're in this together

We are regulating and delivering the built environment to better balance the community's social, cultural, economic and environmental needs. 240 DAs determined in this period, 231 DAs submitted in this period.



We are protecting people and property by managing the risk of flooding. Long-term solution sought for Blacks Drain crossing; Advocated to State and Federal Governments for funding for Murwillumbah CBD Levee and Drainage Study Review.

We are providing high quality and secure water, sewer, rubbish and recycling services. Feedback sought on draft Drought and Water Restrictions Policy; Launched new community education campaign to divert food waste from landfill

We are building healthy, safe and inclusive communities. Community ideas invited for new playground and park facilities at Recreation Ground, Tweed Heads.

We are providing opportunities for the public to inform Council decision making. Expressions of interest sought for 6 Advisory Committees; Adopted Community Strategic Plan; Participated in Tweed Flood Inquiry.

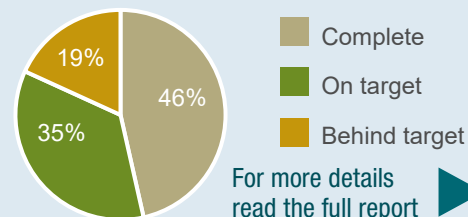
