## SUMMARY OF REPORT:

In 1999 the General Manager developed the concept of the "Local Government Index" that could be applied State wide towards establishing rating levels for properties based upon known and verifiable movements in financial indicators that impact upon Council costs in servicing its community. It was proposed that such an index would be used as a replacement for the allowable limit set under the "rate capping legislation".

Subsequently the issue was taken up by the Local Government and Shires Association (LGSA) who formed a Rating Task Force under the chairmanship of the Lord Mayor of Newcastle, Councillor John Tait. The Task Force consists of a group of Councillors, General Managers and Finance Managers (and includes the Tweed Shire Council's General Manager).

The Task Force in recent times has been working with senior staff of the Department of Local Government and has developed the first stage of the index, which has been reported to the Minister for Local Government (Tier 1). A second stage (Tier 2) is currently under development.

Tier 1 would be proposed as a replacement for the "allowable level" presently set by the State Government and Tier 2 would be reflective of what is presently an "application above the allowable level" (e.g. projects and infrastructure).
