



1. CURRENT INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO BY CATEGORY






2. INVESTMENT RATES - 90 DAY BANK BILL RATE (%)




7. TOTAL FUNDS INVESTED






8. Total Portfolio income

(Managed funds net distributions, term deposits accrued interest and direct securities accrued coupons)




9. PORTFOLIO PERFORMANCE - Current Month annualised return

11. MARKET COMMENTARY

Domestic Economy

The Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) cut the official cash rate by 25 basis points to 7.00%. Tight financial conditions, higher fuel costs and lower asset values "have exerted the needed restraint on demand." Inflation is likely to remain relatively high in the short term even though overall economic growth will slow over the period ahead. The RBA will continue to assess prospects for demand and inflation and set monetary policy as needed to bring inflation back to the 2-3% target over time.

Global Economy

During August the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) reported that OECD economies deteriorated through the middle of the year. Growth was only 0.2% in the June quarter, which was down from 0.5% in the March quarter and the slowest growth for five years. Annual growth declined from 2.5% over the year to the March quarter to 1.9% in the June quarter.

In the United States consumer prices rose at the fastest pace in 17 years, climbing 5.6%. Demand for housing continued to weakened, while existing home sales fell to a 10 year low. One third of all house sales were foreclosures or short sales, in which lenders take a loss on property.

The US Federal Reserve kept the benchmark interest rate at 2.00%, Bank of Japan left rates at 0.50% and Reserve bank of New Zealand cut the official cash rate to 8.00%.

Council's Investment Portfolio Performance

Term deposits and floating rate notes this month are again performing close to long term averages and continue to moderate the volatile returns experienced by the managed funds held in Council's investment portfolio. Council continues to reduce exposure to managed funds and the percentage of funds invested in managed funds is down to 42%. The managed funds Council retains are providing comparable returns to term deposits.



Extreme volatility is still apparent in financial markets, although the effects have been mitigated significantly this month in Council's investment portfolio by sourcing new term deposits and reducing the amount held in managed funds. On average term deposits returned 8% pa to Council during August.

One \$2m Collaterised Debt Obligation that Council held matured at the end of July. The only remaining CDO (Westpac Shield) Council holds will mature in December 2008.

The \$6m Argon Asset Backed Security is currently valued by Oakvale Capital at \$4,149,760 as the Helium component of this structured deal continues to decline in value on a marked to market basis.

The Portfolio Performance graph at Point 9 above shows 8.64% annualised return for the month of August. Council had \$114,468,755 invested as at 31 August 2008 and the net return on these funds was \$754,630 or 6.59% annualised for the month.

SUMMARY OF REPORT:

The initial twelve (12) months of the three (3) year contract term for the Supply and Delivery of Bulk Fuels to Council's Works Depots expires on the 30 September 2008. Provision exists under the terms of the contract for the annual review of Component A: (Suppliers Costs) of the tender schedule.

The bulk fuel supply contract was negotiated as a non exclusive arrangement with Reliance Petroleum and Caltex Australia as the nominated suppliers.

Advice has been received from Reliance and Caltex on the Component A charges that will apply for each delivery location for the period 1 October 2008 until the 30 September 2009.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receives and notes the information provided regarding EC2007-032 Supply and Delivery of Bulk Fuels - Schedule A Supplier Costs Annual Review.



The initial twelve (12) months of the three (3) year contract term for the Supply and Delivery of Bulk Fuels to Council's Works Depots expires on the 30 September 2008.

For Council information the bulk fuel supply contract was negotiated as a non exclusive arrangement with Reliance Petroleum and Caltex Australia as the nominated suppliers.

The tender was separated into two schedules, Schedule A which detailed all Supplier Costs that would be applied to each delivery location and Schedule B detailing all Government and Excise charges that would be applied. Schedule A costs include freight charges, profit margin, credit fees and the actual fuel cost as identified by the Terminal Gate Price (TGP) for the Reliance products or the Caltex Referencing Price (CRP) for the Caltex products. Schedule B (Government and Excise charges) included GST, NSW Fuel Zone Subsidy and the set Federal Government excise fee.

The Schedule A and B price streams are coupled together to give a comparable cent per litre purchase price with purchasing decisions made accordingly.

Provision exists under the terms of the contract for the annual review of Component A: (Suppliers Costs) of the tender schedule.

Advice has been received from Reliance and Caltex on the Component A charges that will apply for each delivery location for the period 1 October 2008 until the 30 September 2009.

The tender brief is to prepare an Environmental Assessment for the Eviron Road Quarry & Landfill Proposal. Recommendations have been formulated based on the Selection Criteria and Pricing Evaluation included in **CONFIDENTIAL ATTACHMENT A.** A summary of the Selection Criteria is also included in the body of this report. It is recommended that Council accepts the tender from GHD for preparation of an Environmental Assessment for the Eviron Road Quarry & Landfill Proposal.
