COUNCIL'S CHARTER

- to facilitate the involvement of councillors, members of the public, users of facilities and services and council staff in the development, improvement and co-ordination of local government;
- to raise funds for local purposes by the fair imposition of rates, charges and fees, by income earned from investments and, when appropriate, by borrowings and grants;
- to keep the local community and the State government (and through it, the wider community) informed about its activities;
- to ensure that, in the exercise of its regulatory functions, it acts consistently and without bias, particularly where an activity of the council is affected;
- to be a responsible employer.

QUESTION ON NOTICE:

Councillor M Armstrong asked:

Given the apparent comparatively high level of housing stress, rental stress, and mortgage stress experienced by Tweed residents please advise:

1. The rate of change (either increase or decrease) in the cost of housing in the Tweed over the past ten (10) years as compared to the regional, state, and national averages;

- 2. The rate of change (either increase or decrease) in the level of housing stress, rental stress, and mortgage stress experienced by Tweed residents over the past ten (10) years as compared to the Regional, State, and National averages;
- 3. The supply of residential property (for either purchase or rent) for low socio-economic families and households;
- 4. The average wait time for people seeking housing through public housing; and
- 5. The rate of change (either increase or decrease) in average household income as compared to the regional, state, and national averages

The General Manager responded as follows:

Housing Stress is defined as per the NATSEM (National Centre for Social and Economic Modelling) model as households in the lowest 40% of incomes who are paying more than 30% of their usual gross weekly income on housing costs.

Housing affordability is a significant issue if mortgage and rent payments rapidly increase as a share of income. While stress can be highly dependent on individual circumstances, using Census data to analyse this provides a good overview of the problems, and highlights any areas in Tweed Shire where households may be having problems meeting their commitments.

Officers have prepared a detailed analysis and is tabled for information. Copies have also been uploaded to Councillors iPads. The analysis addresses all four aspects of the Question on Notice, however a summary of each is provided as follows:

1. According to research conducted by Council staff, house sales within the Tweed local government area have increased by 25% from December 2003 to September 2013. This is in contrast to Kyogle which has experienced an increase of 88%, Richmond Valley 61% and 43% in Lismore local government areas (LGA). It is important to note that during this period, the market did peak in 2009 at a median house price of \$445,000 (an increase of 43%) and then declined to its current level of \$390,000 (a decrease of 12% from 2009). The property market downturn which commenced in 2008, and is only now seeing signs of recovery, has been the cause of this slow growth across the entire housing market.

The Tweed housing market was already relatively mature by 2003 and has not experienced significant price growth over the past ten years compared to more regional areas. The median house sale price in the Tweed for September 2013 was \$390,000. This is well above Kyogle, Richmond and Lismore LGAs but still not as high as Ballina and Byron. For this same period the NSW median sale was \$480,000 and the regional NSW (all NSW excluding urban Sydney) median \$307,000.

Whilst the purchase price of housing is one factor, rental is also another factor. During this period median rental prices on 3 bedroom detached dwellings in the Tweed increased by 46% to from \$260 to \$380 per week.

2. 15.3% of households in the Tweed LGA are experiencing housing stress compared to Richmond Tweed at 15.3%, Regional NSW at 11.4% and NSW 11.4%.

16.5% of households in the Tweed LGA are experiencing mortgage stress compared to Richmond Tweed at 16.6%, Regional NSW at 11.4% and NSW 11.5%.

40.0% of households in the Tweed LGA are experiencing rental stress compared to Richmond Tweed at 38.5%, Regional NSW at 29.6% and NSW 26.7%.

This data has been compiled by ID Consulting and is based on the 2011 Census. Currently, there is no historic analysis of these data sets which is available from ID.

Further analysis is provided in the report tabled.

 On 5 April 2014 Anglicare undertook their annual Rental Affordability Snapshot. The Northern Rivers of NSW was one of the areas surveyed. Their methodology reviewed advertised rental accommodation listings for their suitability for particular socioeconomic groups.

According to their research only 9% of the listing within the Tweed Heads area were suitable for a couple earning a minimum wage with two children. There were no listings for any other category of low socio-economic families. This was the second lowest ranking for all of the centres surveyed, second only to Byron Bay. This is in stark contrast to the rest of the Centres which had rentals suitable for most socio-economic categories.

 Council officers have contacted the Housing Manager for Housing NSW's Northern NSW District asking for a response to this question. To date no response has been received.

The Department identifies that there are 920 houses in the housing stock for Tweed as at September 2013.

According to the North Coast Community Housing joint submission (dated March 2014) to the Senate Standing Committee on Economics Inquiry into Affordable Housing Lismore has a waiting period of up to 10 years for detached house with Mullumbimby seeing waiting times in excess of 10 years.

5. In the Tweed Local Government Area, for couple families with two incomes, the median income for those with children was \$1,878 and those without children was \$1,638.

The Tweed has 32.9% of households in the lowest quintile. That is the lowest quarter of income brackets. This rate has increased by 0.1% between 2011 and 2006. This is compared to 25% of NSW with no growth over the same period. Richmond Tweed has a similar rate to Tweed at 32.7% at 2011."
