## **SUMMARY OF REPORT:**

Fred's Place is an intervention and prevention support service that assists people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness in the Tweed region. Fred's Place offers support services that aim to rebuild lives, improve health and wellbeing, reduce social isolation and work towards inclusion & involvement in community activities.

St Vincent de Paul Lismore 100% funds Fred's Place. Once a year they undertake a fundraising appeal to assist with offsetting the \$300,000 operating costs per annum for Fred's Place.

This report seeks direction from Council as to whether they would like to support the fundraising through the purchase of a corporate table.

## **Addendum Report**

#### **REPORT:**

Fred's Place is an intervention and prevention support service that assists people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness in the Tweed region. Fred's Place offers support services that aim to rebuild lives, improve health and wellbeing, reduce social isolation and work towards inclusion & involvement in community activities.

Tweed Heads (where Fred's Place is located) has one of the highest homeless rates per capita of any city or town in New South Wales. Yet there is no other homeless support service like Fred's Place within the Tweed Shire.

Fred's Place operates Monday to Friday and includes access to a modified house with three bathrooms, shower facilities, a large laundry, a computer room with internet and telephone facilities, a television, dining and recreational spaces, a volunteer staffed kitchen, storage facilities, and mailing facilities.

Free breakfasts and lunches are provided daily. Tea, coffee and snacks are also provided throughout the day, and food packs and toiletries are available for people to take away with them.

Fred's Place also provides a dedicated and equipped room for Centrelink, Medicare, Legal Aid, counselling, and housing support and assistance – all of which are available on a weekly or fortnightly basis. Case management and outreach support is also offered along with assistance to find emergency accommodation.

All services are provided at no cost.

In the last 12 months Fred's Place has helped 11,894 people. They housed 272 people, provided case management support to 462 people and 11,160 people utilised their laundry, meal and shower services.

St Vincent de Paul Lismore 100% funds Fred's Place. Once a year they undertake a fundraising appeal to assist with offsetting the \$300,000 operating costs per annum for Fred's Place.

This year two fundraising events are being held. The inaugural Vinnies Corporate Eatout on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> August, and the Vinnies Community Sleepout supported by Tweed Clubs, being held on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> August. The costs involved for a single ticket to attend the Corporate Eatout event are \$80 for an individual or \$800 for a table of ten. The event commences at 11.30am for a 12pm start to be concluded between 2pm and 2.30pm.
