Boomerang Bags winding back plastic consumption

Avoid using plastic shopping bags and shop locally by supporting a rejuvenated reusable bag program in Pottsville Beach.

St Ambrose Primary School is partnering with Pottsville Beach Neighbourhood Centre to continue the centre's Boomerang Bag project, which is being relaunched this month and is supported by Council.

Boomerang Bags are available from the Pottsville IGA and Pottsville Foodworks for shoppers to borrow and use at both shopping centres, to reduce the use of plastic bags.

'Bought to Support' bags, made from recycled materials, can also be purchased at Pottsville Beach Neighbourhood Centre. Funds are reinvested to make more bags, with about 1800 produced so far.

Sewing bees are held each Tuesday morning at the centre to make more bags. Contact Lorelle 0407 162 378 for more information.

New Tweed Council election date confirmed

Voters in Tweed will go to the polls for the local government election on Saturday 29 October 2016.

A new date had to be chosen after the previous election— scheduled for 10 September – failed following the death of candidate Ken Nicholson last Friday.

Under the Local Government Act (Section 309), "if a candidate dies between noon on nomination day and 6pm on election day, the election fails and a new election in that council area or ward will be held at a later date".

The planned Constitutional Referendum on councillor numbers in the Tweed will also be held on 29 October.

Other effects of the change of election dates are:

- Following the rescheduling of the election, there will be a Mayoral election on 15 September 2016 and again at the first meeting of the new Council in early November. (In the Tweed, Councillors vote for the Mayoral position).
- The NSW Electoral Commission, who is conducting the election on behalf of Council, is waiting on formal advice from the Crown Solicitor's Office in relation to the mechanics of the election, including candidate renomination and ballot draw.
- Council is no longer in caretaker mode as a result of the election being deferred. The new

caretaker period that precedes the election will commence on 30 September.

- The deadline for Expressions of Interest for community members who would like to serve on a number of Council committees for the next four years has been extended to Friday, 11 November. For more information, see www.tweed.nsw.gov.au/Committees

Many councils across the State will go to the polls on 10 September, while others affected by amalgamations will have their elections delayed until next year.

Solar lighting on bus stops

Tweed Shire Council is partnering with the Kingscliff Chamber of Commerce to put solar lighting on 20 bus stops in the shire after the chamber last week secured \$88,000 in funding from the NSW Government's Community Safety Fund.

The chamber applied for the funds to light the bus stops to deter criminal activities such as theft, graffiti and vandalism and to make passengers feel safer while waiting for buses at night.

The chamber made its submission based on both police and anecdotal evidence that lighting improves safety and security because both criminal activity and anti-social behaviour can be seen and reported.

Council will now work with the chamber and bus companies to identify the bus stops where solar lighting is practical and where the greatest benefit to passenger safety and security can be achieved.

Notification of Proposed nbn Fixed Wireless Facility

The nbn™ is an upgrade to Australia's existing telecommunications network. Significant change in road conditions: Tweed motorists travelling north on Tweed Valley Way are advised that road conditions at the Pacific Motorway construction site near Melaleuca Station will change this week. Please see the advertisement on page 6 for full details.

Road closure: Sutherland Street / Casuarina Way, Kingscliff, road closed at Cudgen Creek to allow bridge demolition and replacement. Richards Deviation closed at Tweed Valley Way end for one day on Monday 29 August to allow minor bridge repairs to be carried out. Home Expo advice on household energy savings

Ideas on how to save hundreds of dollars on power hungry televisions and inefficient old appliances will feature as part of this year's 'Living for the Future' Home Expo at the Seagulls Club at Tweed Heads on Saturday 3 September.

Tweed families will learn about the savings initiatives and will have the opportunity to sign up for the NSW Government's Home Energy Action program as part of the display at the Home Expo.

The Home Energy Action program offers 40 to 50 per cent discounts on energy bills for low income households, which are expected to save some families an average of \$140 a year.

Replacing an inefficient fridge can also mean savings of up to \$200 a year, while getting rid of an old television can shave more than \$125 off your annual energy bill.

The program aims to help more than 20,000 low income households across the state to lower their living costs.

The scheme is expected to save enough electricity to power more than 1,800 NSW households a year.

The NSW Government and Tweed Shire Council are also working with leading community service organisations, including Northern Rivers Community Gateway, to ensure their energy hardship clients can easily access the offer, particularly those most in need in areas like the Tweed.

Cudgen Creek dredging to begin in September

Sand dredging in Cudgen Creek is expected to begin next month.

The NSW Department of Trade and Investment Crown Lands (T&I) project will include increasing sand levels on the beaches on either side of the creek mouth.

Site preparations are scheduled to start in early to mid September and are like to take two weeks. Dredging would then begin and it will take approximately seven to eight weeks to complete the dredging and nourishment of sand levels on Kingscliff Beach and the beach area on the south bank of Cudgen Creek.

Portions of beach will be fenced and closed to the public while sand is being transported to that section, but other areas will remain open.

Beach nourishment operations will move progressively along the beach, to minimise interruptions of access to the community.

PUBLIC EXHIBITION

Tweed Local Environmental Plan 2014 – Amendment No. 24 PP16/0003 Variation to Clause 2.8 – Temporary Use of Land

The proposal is to amend cl.2.8(4) & (5) 'Temporary use of land', with the objective of supporting the NSW Government's commitment to the filming industry, and its recognition of the economic value filming has for NSW. This will be achieved by permitting an assessment of the duration of this already permitted land use to be undertaken on a case by case basis opposed to the arbitrary provision of 52 days in any calendar year, which presently exists. It will likewise enable any approved works or improvements to the land to be evaluated and conditioned for their retention or removal.

On 21 July 2016, Council resolved to prepare a planning proposal and seek a Gateway Determination from the Department of Planning and Environment. The Minister for Planning's delegate has issued a Determination Notice requiring public exhibition of the amendment for a minimum of 14 days, and referral to the NSW Rural Fire Service.

Council project presented at national Universal Design conference

Members of the Tweed Equal Access Advisory Committee will present at the second Australian Universal Design Conference in Sydney on 30-31 August. The Tweed delegation will speak about a successful partnership between Council and Committee members in auditing accessible toilet facilities across Tweed Shire, with assistance from Tweed Byron Ballina Community Transport. Proposed Naming of Road in Subdivision
