Council is commissioning two new public artworks in Murwillumbah and Kingscliff and is asking community members to share the themes they would like reflected in these works by writing a 'love letter'.

Hundreds of people shared the love with the help of the distinctive 'Valentines' professional letter writing service at the recent Banana Festival in Murwillumbah and at the Kingscliff Shopping Village.

You can still join the conversation by completing a two-minute survey at yoursaytweed.com.au/town-centre-public-artworks or by filling in the 'love letter' forms at Kingscliff or Murwillumbah libraries.

"From letters about our beautiful natural environment to others highlighting our multicultural communities, there's been such a great response to this project," the project's manager, Judith Evans, said.

"These artworks will be located at entry points to our towns – we want them to be vibrant gateways that local people are proud of.

The proposed areas for the installation of public art are Tweed Valley Way and Alma Street roundabout at Murwillumbah and Kingscliff's freeway underpass on Wommin Bay Road.

Local artists are encouraged to contribute towards the project and Council will soon be calling for Expressions of Interest from artists to bring these ideas to life through public art.

Bikes, bacon and baristas at Jack Bayliss Park

Anyone and everyone with a bike is invited to Jack Bayliss Park at Kingscliff at 8am next Sunday, 25 September for a free breakfast to celebrate NSW Bike Week.

For the donation of a gold coin, riders who show their helmet can pick up a bacon and egg burger cooked by Kingscliff Lions Club, a barista coffee and some top tips from the Kingscliff Cycle Centre with 15-minute tutorials on looking after your bike (8.30 – 8.45am); changing a flat tyre (8.45 – 9am); and, adjusting your brakes (9 – 9.15am). They can also test ride some fun fat-tired and beach cruiser bikes.

They'll also be able to pick up a copy of Council's revised Cycleways Map, which details more than 100 kilometres of shared-user paths across the shire, and Bike Week bags filled with cycling goodies.

NSW Bike Week is an initiative of Transport for NSW and aims to get all members of the community riding their bikes for both transport and recreation.

"We want to see everyone, especially those people whose bikes are forgotten in the back of the shed, out on Sunday on their bikes and rediscovering the joys of riding," Council's Road Safety Officer Alana Brooks said.

"Cycling is a great option for those short trips, and often you'll pedal there quicker than it takes you to get the car out, drive there, find a parking spot and then walk to where you're going. With a bike, you can often pull up right at the front door."

The garage sales are part of 'Second Hand Saturday', an initiative which aims to reduce the amount of waste going to landfill as well as promoting sustainability and community life.

Hundreds of households, neighbourhoods, schools and community organisations participate in 'Secondhand Saturday' each year, receiving free listing online and in newspaper advertisements to attract buyers to their garage sales.

Seven north coast councils are involved in the initiative with the Tweed region leading the sign-ups with 186 registered garage sales including Murwillumbah's Colleen Fitzgerald, a Director at 'The Johnny Young Talent School' at Ashmore.

"I've been collecting things from the theatre and movies for about 50 years – there's 50 years of memories here," Ms Fitzgerald said.

"I'm looking forward to handing things over that have been special to me and giving them a new life, I hope they'll bring that same enjoyment to other people.

"Everyone has been saying to me that I should get rid of some of my stuff, but I never do, I hang onto things. Second Hand Saturday is a great chance to give so many items a new home."

Paralympics champ speaks at awards

Paralympic gold medallist Tracy Barrell of Tweed Heads has spent a lifetime teaching people about acceptance and inclusion, but feels progress in Australian society has been very slow.

The dual gold medal swimmer at the 1992 Paralympics was born without legs and with one arm and has broken many barriers through her determination to be active in mainstream community. But Ms Barrell, guest speaker at this year's Tweed Access and Inclusion Awards presentation, said she has seen little evidence that Australians in general had become more accepting or inclusive of people with disability.

"That makes initiatives like the Access Awards all the more important, to change attitudes towards people with disability and the roles they can play in community," she said. "Accessibility is not all about physical ability, it really comes down to attitude and how people treat anyone with disability."

Ms Barrell received an Order of Australia for contributions to swimming and went on to forge a career as a project manager, guest speaker and an advocate for people with disability, particularly for Aboriginal communities.

Brain-boosting program to tackle dementia

A new access program designed to stimulate the brains of people with dementia has been launched at Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre.

The MemoryScape program, launched in September as part of Dementia Awareness Month, provides a pleasant, alternative, mutually-shared social experience tailored particularly for people with dementia, their families and carers.

"Viewing artwork can engage, stimulate and ignite memories," the Gallery's Education and Audience Development Officer, Jodi Ferrari, said.

"A self-guided MemoryScape tour has been created for visitors, with a printed guide available to lead them around the exhibition A-Z: the alphabet in art, which is on exhibition in The Withey Family Gallery until 16 July 2017.

"The tour sheet has suggested questions to ignite conversation and

memories. Suggested artworks to be viewed are marked with a label near the artwork label."

Ms Ferrari said visitor could also pop on the headphones in the Margaret Olley Art Centre's iPad area to enjoy classical music by the Australian Chamber Orchestra.

"Music can help people living with dementia to recall memories and emotions and its many benefits include boosting brain activity," she said. "Stimulating an aging brain may be a key part of dementia prevention."

Turf theft continues

While Council has completed work on its second Koala Zone in the shire it cannot call the job finished because a thief continues to steal turf from the roadside verges.

Over the past month, the thief has taken up to 10 cubic metres of turf from the Coronation Drive worksite in Pottsville three times.

Council is appealing for help from the community to catch the culprit. If anyone sees people acting suspiciously or a vehicle stopped at the worksite at night, please take note of the make and model of that vehicle and numberplate and report it to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or Council's after hours number on 1800 818 326.

Lights off at Kennedy and Limosa

Council this week will switch the lights off at the Kennedy Drive and Limosa Road intersection, Tweed Heads West, to assist peak-hour traffic flow through its roadworks. The lights will be off between 7.30am and 10.30am but may be extended beyond these hours if required. Council expects the kerb, gutter and footpath works on Kennedy Drive to be complete by Friday 30 September. It will then schedule contractors to apply the permanent road surface in the first week of October, weather permitting.
