Please keep this guide to Quarterly Water Billing and Meter Reading

Council will notify customers about the start date for quarterly meter reading and billing as soon as possible through the Tweed Link and Council's website.

In the meantime, it is important that customers realise different areas in the Tweed will have their water meters read at different times in a

13-week period and this schedule will determine when a customer will receive their water bill.

The Tweed has been broken into separate areas (Numbered 1 to 11).


Different areas will be read each week. The table below and the maps (where applicable) will assist you to determine into which area your property falls.








Map B: Tweed Heads











Map F: Bilambil Heights
