Note: All works connecting plumbing fixtures (e.g. connection to laundry, toilet etc.) or connection to the town water supply must be done by a NSW licensed plumber. Council's Building and Environmental Health Unit (02 6670 2400) should be consulted to ascertain the SEPP conditions and approval requirements if in doubt. All installations and ongoing operation and maintenance must comply with Council's Policy entitled "Rainwater Tanks in Urban Areas".

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
