Save water now to delay restrictions

Following last week's El Nino declaration by the Bureau of Meteorology and less-than-average rainfall now forecast for the Northern Rivers, Council is urging everyone in the Tweed to save water now to prolong the Tweed's water supply.

Water and Wastewater Business and Assets Manager Michael Wraight said without significant rain, the Tweed will head into water restrictions, with restrictions for Tyalgum looking likely in the next couple of weeks.

"We source our water from the Tweed River at Bray Park and Uki, plus the Oxley River at Tyalgum. The river flows are down and the weir pools at Bray Park and Tyalgum are drying up," Mr Wraight said.

"While Clarrie Hall Dam is currently sitting at 98% capacity, it will now drop about 1 to 1.5% a week as we start releasing water to supply the Bray Park Weir - the source of water for most of the Shire.

"We will trigger level 1 water restrictions when the Clarrie Hall dam level drops to 85%.

"Restrictions at Tyalgum will be introduced sooner. The flow of the Oxley River at Tyalgum is down to a trickle and the weir pool there is dropping fast."

Inbound lane only for bridge

Council is urging motorists to plan ahead and consider alternative routes between the CBD and South Murwillumbah for about four weeks while essential upgrades to the town's sewer main are underway.

Traffic delays and detours can be expected. The Wollumbin Street bridge will be reduced to a single lane,

allowing one-way traffic only into the Murwillumbah CBD. Detours are in place for outbound traffic via Cane Road, using Queensland Road or Tumbulgum Road, or Bakers

Road and Mistral Road. The works started this week, and the bridge is closed to

outbound traffic during work hours (Monday to Thursday, 6 am to 6 pm), causing some delays. The other lane and footpath will remain open under traffic control.

Outside of these work hours, the bridge will remain open to traffic in both directions.

First cane toad event

Cane toads are a damaging invasive pest that cause declines in native wildlife, can poison domestic pets and impact local agricultural industries.

Council has partnered with experts Watergum to launch the 2023/24 cane toad season filled with a range of information sessions and community cane toad busts across the Shire.

Residents are invited to the first event of the season - a free information session on Wednesday 4 October from 6 to 7:30 pm at the Pottsville Beach Community Hall to learn how to protect the biodiversity within your own backyard.

Community participation in cane toad control is critical to reducing cane toad numbers. 

Not only is the platform looking better than ever, it is now accessible for everyone to use including people with a disability, impaired mobility and prams.

Viewing platform re-opens

Access to views have been improved and the path widened with more comfortable seating including back and arm rests.

As part of Council's commitment to reducing its impact on the natural environment the old timber decking has been replaced with long-lasting decking made from a combination of recycled plastics and wood waste that is extremely resistant to the harsh weather conditions.

Other recycled elements of the project included re-using quality timber from the Anchorage Islands Harbour Project

The new viewing platform was funded through the NSW Government's Environmental Trust as part of the NSW Environment Protection Authority's Waste Less, Recycle More initiative.
